Unit Check-in and Set up

Check-in time is between 5:00 pm and 8:00 pm on Friday, September 11 at the WOW headquarters.

Campsite locations will be assigned at Check-in, so please do not start setting up camp before this time or you may end up having to move.

Unit Leaders - You will need the following 3 documents at Check-in:

1. Attendance Roster by Den.
 2. Medical Forms (A & B) 1 copy for WOW and 1 Copy for Unit at campsite. (Scouts & Adults).
 3. Permission Slip for each Scout.
- You will be advised of your Unit's campsite at check-in. Once you have unloaded your equipment, please move (ALL VEHICLES TO THE DESIGNATED PARKING AREAS). only trailers that are part of the campsite, to be inspected are allowed to be in the campsite. Vehicles hooked to a trailer are the only ones allowed in the campsite.
 - Points will be deducted from your score if any vehicles are left in the campsite area.
 - If you have Campers, Leaders, or Parents with special needs, you must contact the WOW! Staff prior to Registration so arrangements can be made.
 - Lights out will be at 10:30 pm on Friday night and 11:00 pm on Saturday night. Lights out applies to all Scouts and siblings attending. We ask that any Adults who are up beyond the "lights out" be courteous to surrounding camps as well as your own campers who are trying to sleep.

Unit Checkout

Check-Out time will begin at 10:00 am on Sunday, September 13th. When ready to Check-out, remove all gear and police all of your campsite and common areas. The WOW! Staff must do the final inspections before Units will receive patches.

Prohibited Items from Scouts

- Radios, MP3 Players, Cell Phones, or Portable Game devices. This is an outdoor event and often includes dirt, rain, mud, and activities that aren't compatible with delicate electronics. Use of Walkie Talkies should be limited to Leaders and only in emergencies.
- Failure to comply could result in lost points for your Unit.
- Knives, Leather Man type multi tools, hatchets, axes, and bow saw - Webelos are at no time to be in possession of any of these items.
- Any Webelos or Bear Scouts carrying a knife, even if they have their whittling card, will be in violation of rules and will cause their Unit to lose 50 points off their total score.

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Adventure Pin Classes & Challenges (Events)

Adventure Pin Classes (Afternoon) 1:00 pm - 4:20 pm

There will be 2 classes in the Afternoon and each Scout will attend 2 classes.

Adventures

Build it.

Into the Woods

Adventure Pin Classes will not count toward the competition.

Scouts will have the opportunity to "pick up" additional points if they are caught in the act of doing the right thing on their own. This could be an opportunity to "pick up" some extra points throughout the day.

Fire Building

Supplies other than tinder will be on hand. Bring your own tinder. No fuel propellants (fire starters and such), This will be a timed event. Objective is to build a fire and burn a string. The first string will be at 12 inches. (This is to be the limit to the height of your fire build.) The second string will be at 18 inches. This is the string you are to attempt to burn.

Each group will be given five minutes to build fire.

- Groups burning the string in 2 minutes or under using flint and steel will earn 100 points.
- Groups burning the string in 2 minutes or under using a match will earn 80 points.
- Groups burning the string in under 5 minutes using a flint and steel will earn 75 points.
- Groups burning the string in under 5 minutes using a match will earn 55 points.
- Groups burning the string in over 5 minutes will earn 40 points for participation.
- If all groups take over 5 minutes the one with the least time wins.
- One point for each attempt to start fire will be subtracted from above score if multiples have the same score.
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Log Lift (Knot Tying)

- Tie two ropes together with a square knot.
- Attach weight (a sock full of rocks, a heavy washer, bean bag, or stick) with two half hitches. (Check this one at the time it is tied as it will be untied to tie rescue knot.)
- Throw rope over support.
- Tie bowline on BRAVE (log) and have a scout lift him.
- Tie taut line to stake and see if ropes will hold the BRAVE (log).
- Scouts remove BRAVE (log) to safety.
- Responsibilities to be divided among members of the patrol (den).
- Score by time.
- Score by correctness of knots. (add 30 seconds if incorrect)
- Score by brave staying aloft when lifted (add 30 seconds if brave drops.)

Obstacle Course

- All patrol members to run obstacle course.
- An Average will be taken to give score.

Stretcher Race

Three teams race at a time. Record winner's times to establish 1st, 2nd & 3rd places. Only record times for winners of each race. In case of tie race the two teams.

Kim's Game

There will be native and nature items under a blanket. The blanket will be lifted for one minute. Once the blanket is returned the patrol (den) must list as many items as they can remember. Time and number of items will be taken into consideration for score. The least amount of time with the most correct items will win. There should be about 15 to 20 items under blanket.

Approximately 180 minutes are allowed for all of this to take place. If this grows to be an overly large event; I suggest we have three set ups for each of the five events. I also suggest if it is allowable that the whole group is given the shooting sports talk and then they are allowed to shoot on a schedule.

Adult Competition

Dutch Oven Cook Off - Items must be delivered to the WOW! Headquarters by 6:45 pm on Saturday for judging. Prizes will be awarded at the campfire.

Scoring of Units.

All Units will be awarded points throughout the day for the various events that they are taking part in.

At the end of the day, the scores will be tabulated, and the top Units will be recognized at the Campfire on Saturday night.

Scores will be bases on:

Uniform Inspection - (Class A) Conducted at the morning assembly at the flagpole. Uniforms will be checked that they are neat, worn properly, and that all insignia is properly displayed. A copy of the Uniform Inspection Checklist for Webelos and Bears can be found online. Scouts will only be inspected from the waist up.

Unit Cheer - Units will be asked to perform their cheer at every event and could be approached at any time during the event to perform their Unit cheer/yell. Only the judges will know which ones count for their score.

Unit Spirit - Points based on regular and ongoing display of spirit through unit yells/display of unit flags on and off the campsite.

Challenges - Total score for the competition of all five challenge phases.
