\* This includes Adults and Scouts. You will get them back at checkout

## EACH PARTICIPANT WILL HAVE THEIR TEMPERATURE CHECKED.

\* Upon arrival at Camp Mack Morris every vehicle must check-in and every participant must have their temperature taken. All vehicles must stop- NO EXCEPTIONS.

\* Participants will be required to WEAR FACE MASK while attending the activities. While at any activity outside your campsite

participants will be required to wear face masks.

\* Hand sanitizer and other cleaning and disinfecting products will be available in common areas/bathrooms.

# CHECK-OUT

## Leaders Cracker Barrel -All registered Leaders required to attend.

All registered Leaders should plan to attend the Cracker Barrel Friday evening at 9:30 at the WOW headquarters to get information on any changes, last minute instructions and to review the procedures for the next day's events. ### Saturday activities.

- Each den will be assigned a schedule for the activity rotation. The classes themselves will last about 60 minutes; each with 10 minutes for walking and bathroom breaks between rotations. Morning events will last about 3 hours.

### Saturday campfire ceremony information.

Parents and families are urged to attend the Campfire ceremony Saturday evening. It is tentatively set to begin at 8:00. All Webelos and Bear dens should be ready with a den yell and a den skit. Please ensure that all flashlights, spotlights, etc. are turned off during this event: except in emergency. WOW staff will have all lighting and sound needed for the campfire program. All Scouts and Leaders should wear Class B uniform to the campfire ceremony. All skits must be approved by the WOW staff before the campfire.

### Miscellaneous Information.

**General Appearance.** Allow 4 points for each:

- Good posture
- Clean face and hands
- Combed hair
- Neatly dressed
- Clean fingernails

**Headgear.** Webelos cap. Webelos activity badges are worn on the plaid front panel of the Webelos cap or on the optional Webelos color s, if selected by the pack.

**Shirt.** Webelos Scouts have the option of wearing either the long- or short-sleeve navy blue shirt and navy-blue shorts or pants OR the long- or short-sleeve tan shirt with the official Boy Scout pants or shorts. The blue shoulder loops are worn on epaulets regardless of the uniform color.

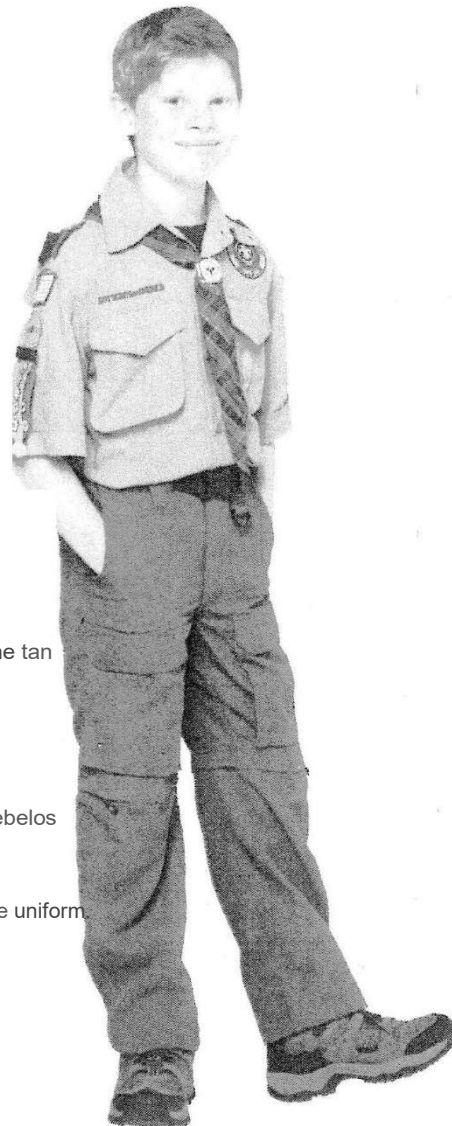

**Neckwear.** Triangular, plaid neckerchief secured by the Webelos rank slide. Notes \_\_\_\_\_

**Pants/Shorts.** Webelos Scouts may wear either the official navy-blue pants or shorts (with the navy-blue shirt), or official Boy Scout pants or shorts (with the tan shirt). Notes \_\_\_\_\_

**Belt.** Official navy-blue web belt cut to proper length with the Webelos insignia on the buckle. Cub Scout belt loops are worn only on the navy-blue belt. Webelos Scouts wearing the optional tan uniform wear the navy-blue belt and Webelos buckle. Notes \_\_\_\_\_




**Socks.** The official navy-blue socks (with gold tops) are worn with the navy-blue uniform. The official socks are worn with the official Boy Scout uniform. Notes \_\_\_\_\_

**Shoes.** Leather or ca11vas, neat and clea11. Notes \_\_\_\_\_

**Registration.** Current membership card or temporary certificate on person. Notes \_\_\_\_\_

**Insignia** Correct placement: left pocket, 5 points; right pocket, 5 points; left sleeve, 5 points; right sleeve, 5 points.

NO TIMES OR SCORES TO BE SHARED BEFORE CAMPFIRE.

### Fire Building

Supplies other than tinder will be on hand. Bring your own tinder. No fuel propellants (fire starters and such) . This will be a timed event. Objective is to build a fire and burn a string. The first string will be at 12 inches. ( This is to be the limit to the height of your fire build.) The second string will be at 18 inches. This is the string you are to attempt to burn. Each group will be given five minutes to build fire.

- Groups burning the string in 2 minutes or under using flint and steel will earn 100 points.
- Groups burning the string in 2 minutes or under using a match will earn 80 points.
- Groups burning the string in under 5 minutes using a flint and steel will earn 75 points .
- Groups burning the string in under 5 minutes using a match will earn 55 points.
- Groups burning the string in over 5 minutes will earn 40 points for participation.
- If all groups take over 5 minutes the one with the least time wins.
- One point for each attempt to start fire will be subtracted from above score if multiples have the same score.

### Log Lift (Knot Tying)

1. Tie two ropes together with a square knot.
2. Attach weight (a sock full of rocks, a heavy washer, bean bag, or stick) with two half hitches. (Check this one at the time it is tied as it will be untied to tie rescue knot.)
3. Throw rope over support.
4. Tie bowline on BRAVE (log) and have a scout lift him.
5. Tie taut line to stake and see if ropes will hold the BRAVE (log).
6. Scouts remove BRAVE (log) to safety.

Responsibilities to be divided among members of the patrol (den).

- Score by time.
- Score by correctness of knots. (add 30 seconds if incorrect)
- Score by brave staying aloft when lifted (add 30 seconds if brave drops.)

### Obstacle Course

- All patrol members to run obstacle course.
- An Average will be taken to give score.

### Gaga Ball

#### Prohibited Items from Scouts

- **Radios, MP3 Players, Cell Phones, or Portable Game devices. This is an outdoor event and often includes dirt, rain, mud, and activities that aren't compatible with delicate electronics. Use of Walkie Talkies should be limited to Leaders and only in emergencies.**
- **Failure to comply could result in lost points for your Unit.**
- **Knives, Leather Man type multi tools, hatchets, axes, and bow saw - Webelos are at no time to be in possession of any of these items.**
- **Any Webelos Scouts carrying a knife, even if they have their whittling card, will be in violation of rules and will cause their Unit to lose 50 points off their total score.**
